Board of Zoning Appeals Activities:

- June 23, 2016 BZA Meeting:
 - o <u>BZA04-2016</u>: Applicants, Todd and Lisa Dorn, are requesting a Variance from Section 4.13 D. 1. c. of the Sugarcreek Township Zoning Resolution to allow for a shed at a setback of a 3' from the property line. The subject property is 417 Kilkenny Court, parcel L32000100011005500, owned by Todd and Lisa Dorn, containing 0.300 acres, and located in the R-1B (Suburban Residential-Moderate District).

Zoning Commission Activities:

- June 7, 2016 BZC Meeting Follow-Up:
 - O BZC Case 02-2016: Applicant, Inverness Group, Inc., is requesting Final Development Plan Approval for Section 3 of the Landings of Sugarcreek subdivision. The subject parcel is 3820 Upper Bellbrook Road, contains 85.52 acres, can be further identified by parcel number L32000100120001900, is owned by Inverness Group, Inc., and is located in the PUD-R (Residential Planned Unit Development) District. Section 3 is proposed to contain a total of 32 building lots and 16.294 acres.
 - The BZC recommended approval subject to conditions. This case will be considered by the Trustees at the June 20, 2016 Regular Meeting.
 - o Discussion on Agritourism (initiation of text amendment anticipated)

The BZC made a motion to initiate a text amendment to the Sugarcreek Township Zoning Resolution to address agritourism uses. The text has been sent to the Greene County RPCC for a recommendation.

July 12, 2016 BZC Meeting

O BZC Case 03-2016: The Sugarcreek Township Zoning Commission initiated, by passage of a motion, text amendments to the Sugarcreek Township Zoning Resolution. The text amendments initiated establish agritourism uses as permitted in every zoning district subject to standards. Included in the amendment are associated definitions.
